 Koh Samui and Thai resorts now disaster zones and hotel guests forced to flee to Phuket and Bangkok -

Thousands of tourists are caught up in a flooding emergency in southern Thailand, in which at least 14 people have died.

Swedes' top travel destinations for 2017 -

 New long haul flight for Swedes and Danes yet more flights might be cancelled if the runway is closed -

Plans to expand the busiest airport in the Nordics may create 17 new long-haul routes, with southern Swedes to benefit as well as Danes. CPH wants to add 17 long-haul routes to the existing 36, doubling the size of the aircraft stands area to 1,900,000sqm.

 Singapore Airlines adds Stockholm and the flights are to be launched in May, to fly via Moscow -

Stockholm will be added to Singapore Airlines' route network in May, becoming the second Scandinavian city on the SIA map with aircraft flying to the Swedish capital via Moscow

Flights to Stockholm are due for launch on May 30 and will be operated with an Airbus A350-900, the latest addition to the SIA fleet. The route will complement the airline's existing flights to Copenhagen.

• Trend stays upward at Sweden's airports and International traffic up 10% during November - International traffic increased by a full 10% during November, year-on-year (1,938,000), though there was no change in domestic traffic (1,262,000), to reach a total for the month of 3,201,000.

Passenger volume in European traffic increased by 9%, while traffic to and from the rest of the world increased by 12%.
